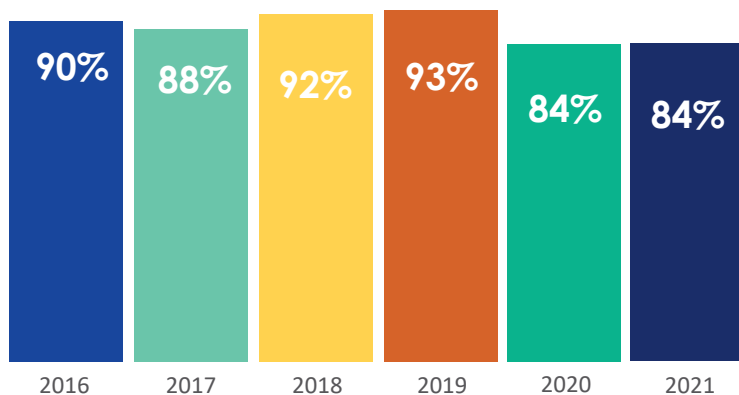


IRELAND AND THE EU 2021

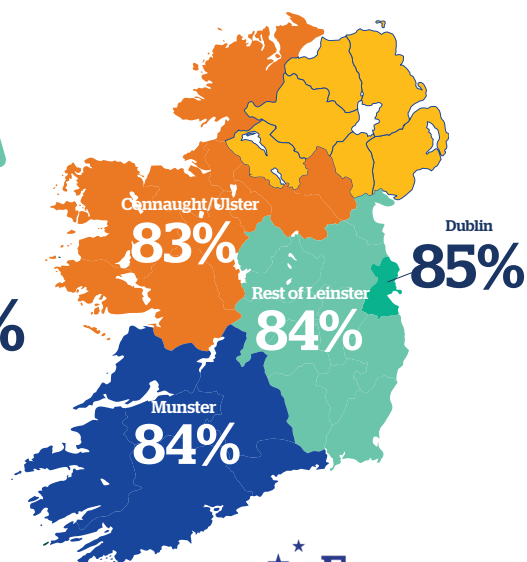
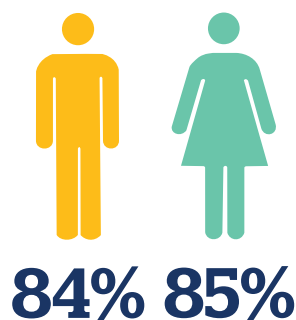
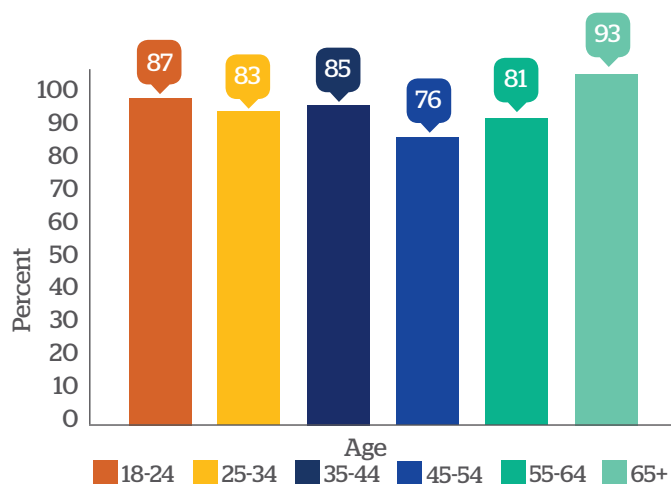
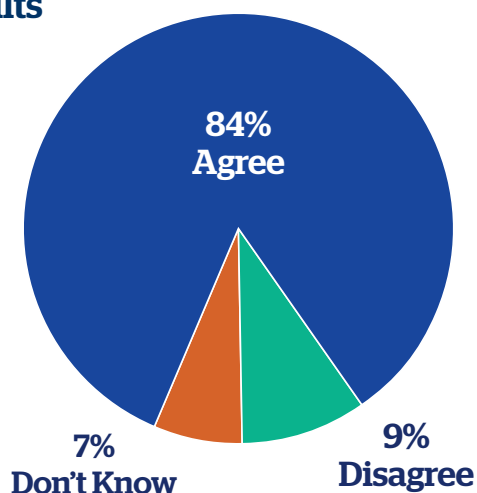
This infographic illustrates the results of a RED C opinion poll, commissioned by European Movement Ireland to ascertain the views of people in Ireland on a variety of topics related to Irish-EU relations. The poll was conducted between the dates 19 - 25 March 2021 among a representative sample of 1,003 people aged 18 and over from across the country. A series of statements was read out and respondents were asked by RED C to Agree Strongly, Agree Slightly, Disagree Strongly or Disagree Slightly. We have grouped responses into Agree and Disagree, and have included when respondents said Don't Know.

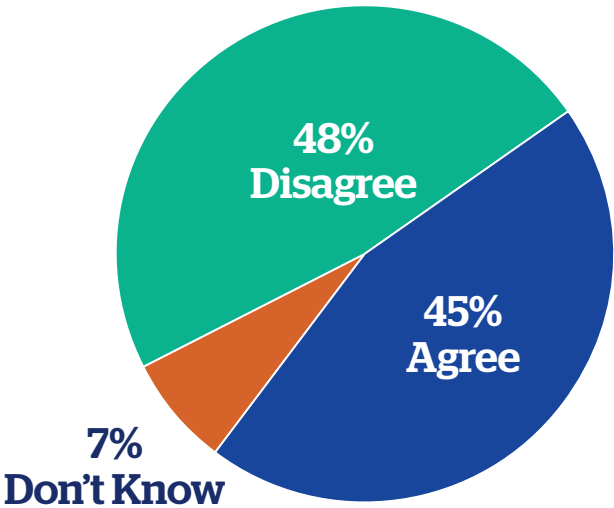

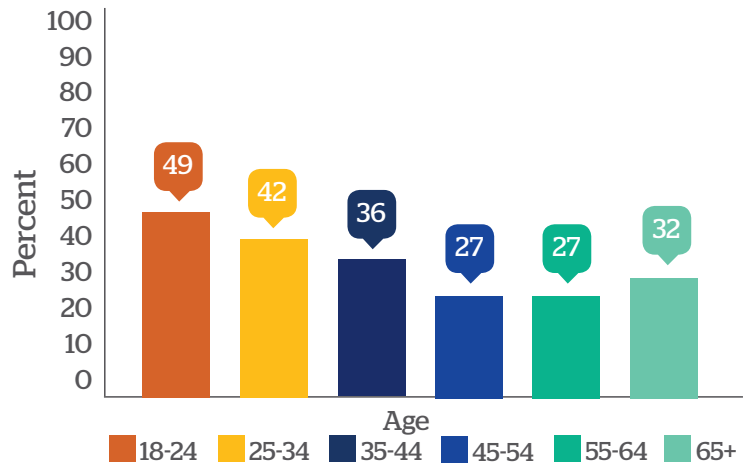


In order to deal with crises, such as Covid-19, Ireland and other Member States should give the EU more control over healthcare policy, even if they lose some control on a national level

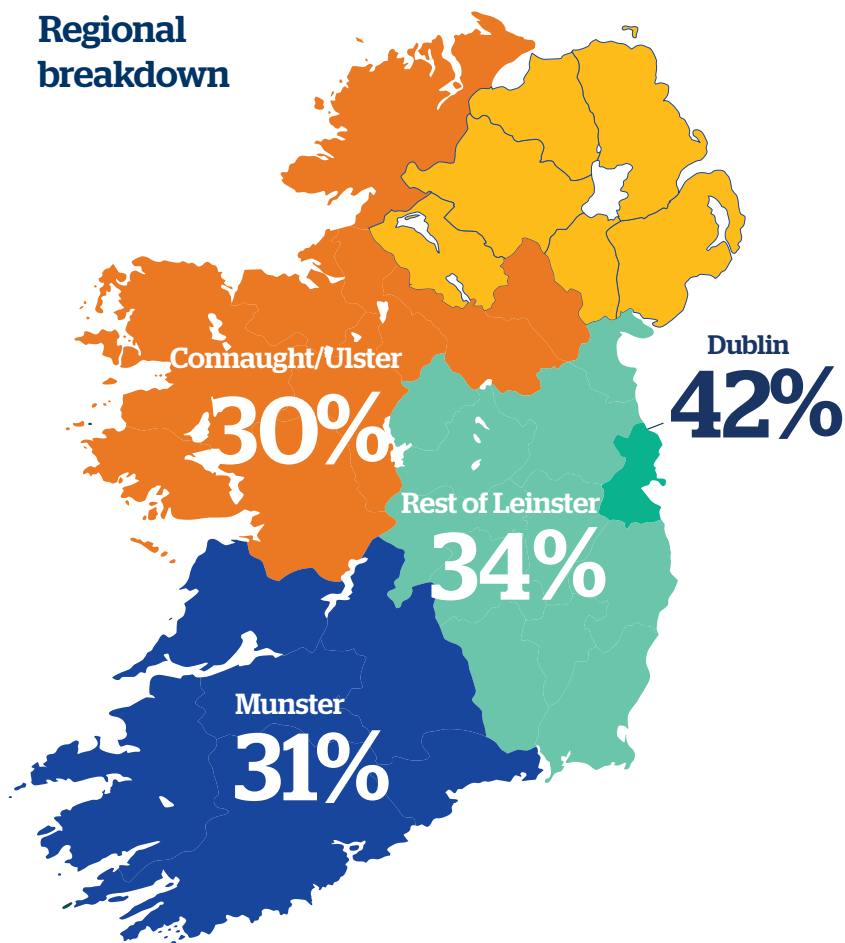

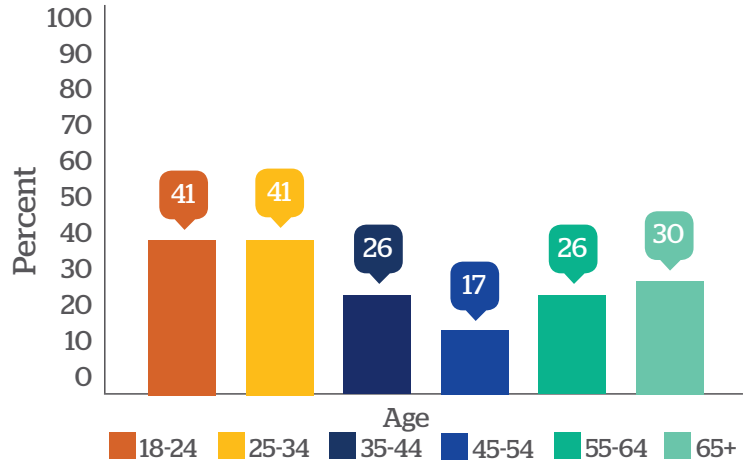


There should be more political and economic integration in the EU even if this means that Member States lose control over economic policy, e.g. tax

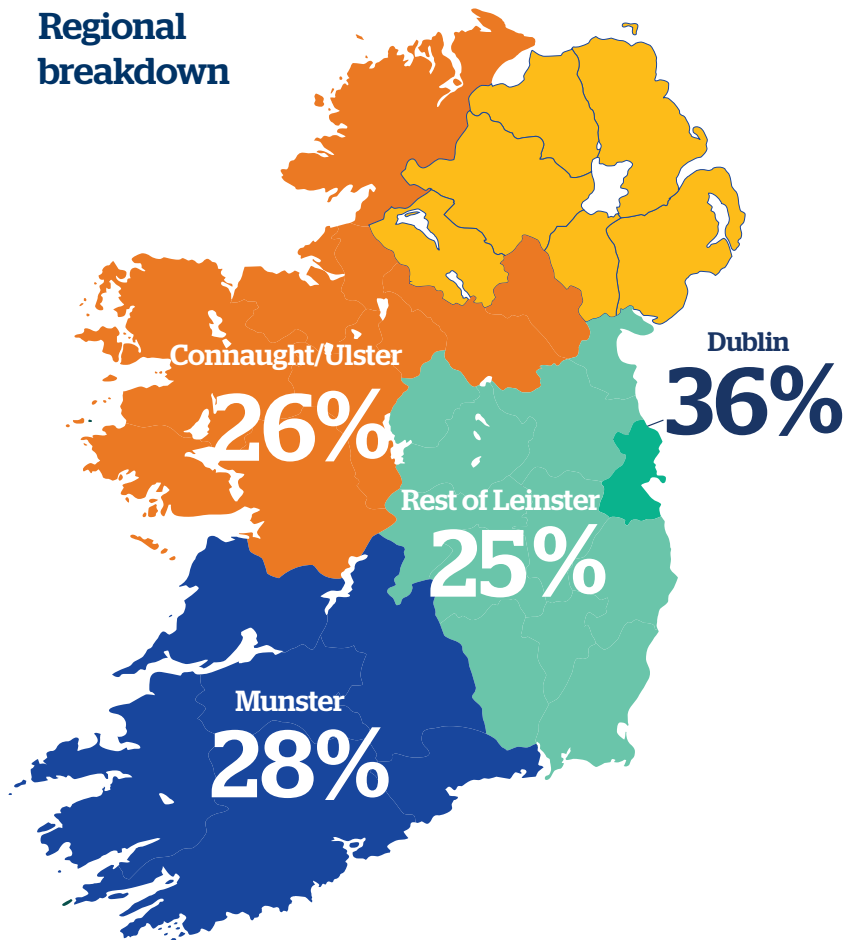
